


DEVELOPMENT AND LOSS OF ACCESS

- Urbanization and development reduced natural sweetgrass availability (Muhlenbergia filipes)
- Road expansions removed traditional roadside harvesting areas
- Habitat fragmentation and shoreline loss from erosion

THE PROJECT VISION

- Restore sweetgrass habitat on conserved lands
- Ensure sustainable harvesting for basket makers
- Integrate cultural heritage into conservation strategies
- Use native plants to stabilize shorelines and improve resilience

PROJECT STEPS

- 1. Seed Harvesting From native, local ecotypes
- 2. Propagation Growing sweetgrass in nurseries
- 3. Planting Along marsh edges, dunes, and conserved areas
- 4. Maintaining Ensuring habitat health and resilience
- 5. Harvest & Donation Providing materials to artisans at no cost





LEARNING CENTER VIEW FROM FRONT LAWN




